## Eugene's Parks and Natural Areas



### Joining Forces to Create City Center Skatepark

POS is partnering with Downtown Rotary and the nonprofit organization Skaters for Eugene to create an 18,000-square foot skatepark facility in downtown Eugene. It will be the largest covered and lit skatepark in the region, providing year-round skating opportunities. The park is expected to be heavily used by after-school instructional programs and has the support of School District 4J, Eugene City Council, County Commissioners, and more than 1,700 local petitioners who have passionately advocated for this skatepark since the early stages in

2004. Matching funds from the City are available for this project through system development charges. Skaters for Eugene and Downtown Rotary have taken on the goal of raising an additional \$300,000 by the end of 2009 in order to bring the project to reality.
